Trail map point 9 refers to an old road that once ran along the northern border of the property.



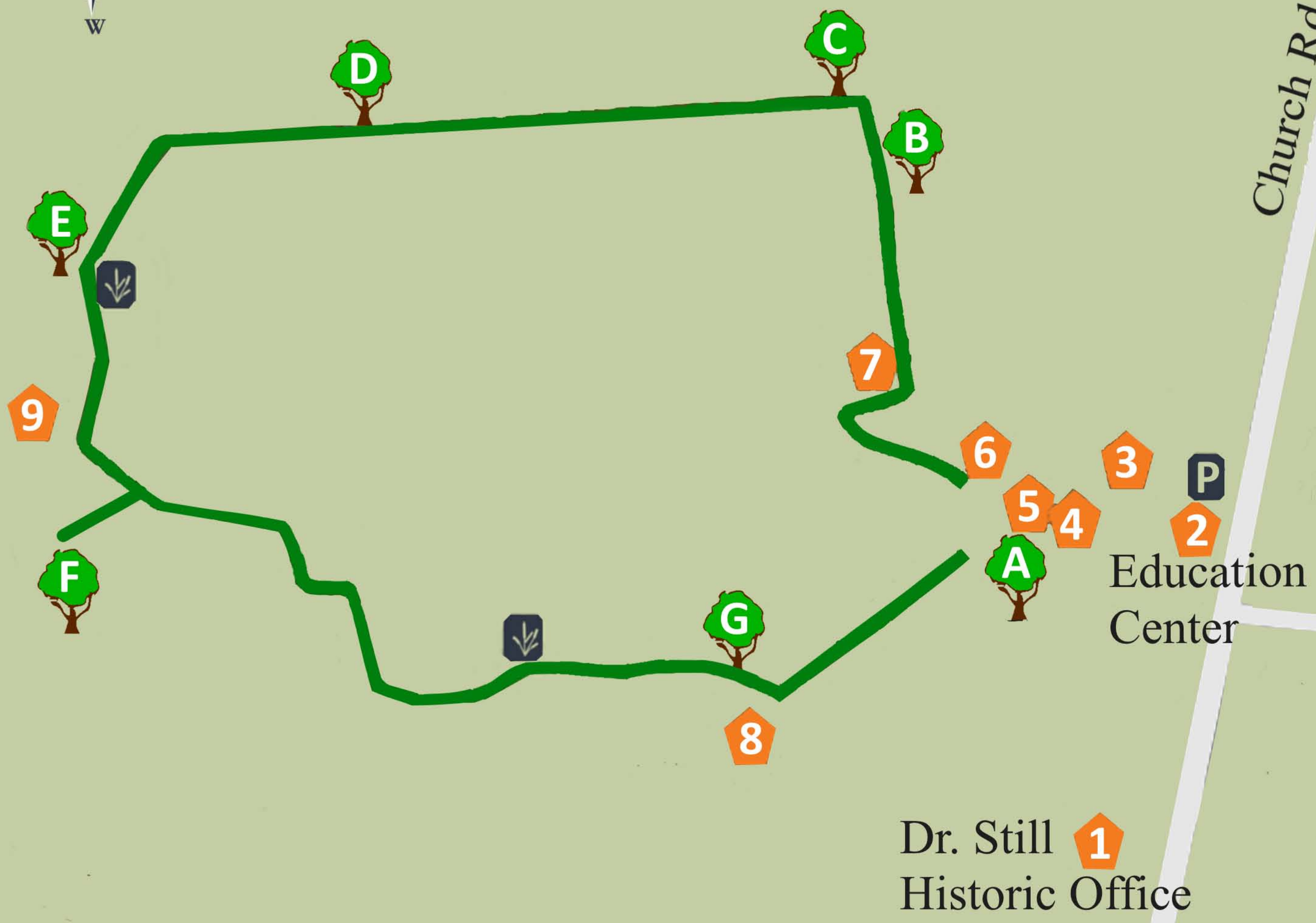
Shown on the same map, trees E & F grew along the old road. These two oaks are about 170 & 200 years old. Dr. Still most likely passed these very trees in his travels!

QR Code - The trademark for a type of matrix barcode. These barcodes are present on signage throughout the trail. Scanning these barcodes with a smart phone QR reader links to additional information.



- 1** Dr. James Still Office - The Dr. James Still Office is a one-story hip-roofed frame structure constructed in 1836.
- 2** Dr. James Still Historic Site Education Center - The circa 1920 Bunnig Farm house serves as an educational center to preserve and teach the legacy of Dr. James Still.
- 3** The Bunning Farm - The Bunning family raised raised cows and chickens on their farm until it was sold to the state of New Jersey in 2007. The farm includes not only the farm house but a barn, stables, corn crib, and other buildings.

- 4 5** Tractor & Corn Crib - In front of the old corn crib are the remains of an antique steel wheeled tractor.
- 6** Nature Trail - In 2018 Matthew Mason and other scouts from troop 26 in Medford, NJ completed a nature trail on the grounds of the former Bunning farm.
- 7** Livestock Shelter - The remains of a livestock shelter is located here.
- 8** Outbuildings - The remains of several buildings are located here. The national register of historic places describes them as mid-twentieth century origin.

- 9** Old Road - Along the northern edge of the property the remains of an old road are visible.
